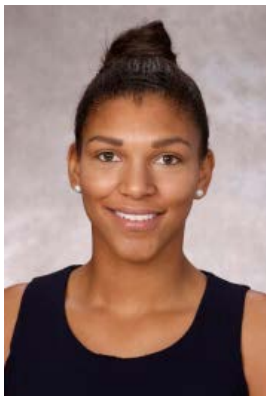




MICA MEDICAL FOUNDATION SCHOLARS
